STATEMENT

I started this project with the observation of tents. I watched as thousands of festival goers discard perfectly good tents at the end of weekends. Simultaneously, these identical layers of nylon could mean the difference between life and death, for refugees living in unfathomable conditions globally. Once a tent is broken its now unfit as a shelter it becomes a waste of space, but the materials stay the same. I want to change people's perspective on the potential of what it is they are really throwing away and what good can be made of what is essentially a rolled-up bag of usable matter. Shelter is one of the essentials a person needs to survive, however I'd like the bridge the gap between survival and living an enriched life. I proceeded to collect these materials and repurpose them to create tools for refugees to use in a workshop that travels to them. Tools that can be used to celebrate the traditional craft originating in country's refugees have been forced to flee. Creating a space that gives them the chance to regain what they have left behind and ease the detachment from home.


TENT WASTE








She has walked all the way from Syria.

























Chapter 4 TENT EXPERIMENTS

How can I use tents as a material to bring to life middle eastern culture?




Palestinians keep hold of the old keys of their homes, with the hopes to return one day.

Starting small by shaping the tent pegs into keys to create games for children to play.








Bells are attached to the feet of pidgins' in Jordan so they rattle when they fly over head.








Bells made for a workshop proposal, making door bells for temporary living in refugee camps.










Yarn spun from the fly over material.






TENT COUNTERPARTS

Textiles taken from tent flyover.

Bicycle wheel packed with ground sheet for the bottom disk.

Tent poles fixed together for a kick stick.

Guy ropes knotted and used to suspend the kick stick.
