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Target audience for 5 ½ day course:	<b>Teachers and Teaching Assistants</b> in primary, secondary & special schools.																				
Course Description:	<p>The Communication, Learning and Autism Support Service are again running their popular course for dyslexia accredited by the University of Brighton.</p> <p>Students will learn how to identify and support pupils at risk of dyslexia; look at the emotional effects; assess reading/writing skills; plan direct and indirect intervention and consider dyslexia friendly environments. The course will enable schools to fulfil part of their roles &amp; responsibilities as set out in the East Sussex Dyslexia Policy.</p> <p>The course accreditation requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 5 ½ days attendance plus attendance of the 1 hour Twilight information session</li> <li>• Completion of learning activities after each taught day</li> <li>• Work with a pupil assessed at risk of dyslexia (1:1 teaching for a set period)</li> <li>• Successful monitoring observation (by course tutor)</li> <li>• Submission of a 2,000 word assignment and separate 2,000 word case study file</li> </ul> <p>School requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• School to provide the Teacher/TA with a mentor for school-based activities</li> <li>• Time allocation of at least weekly input with child – assessment and teaching</li> <li>• Reasonable time allowance to complete homework and final assignments.</li> </ul> <p>The course is accredited by the University of Brighton and students can gain 30 credits which can be used towards other courses.</p> <p>The <b>Teachers</b> on the course will be assessed at <b>Level 6</b> and the <b>Teaching Assistants</b> will be assessed at <b>Level 4</b>.</p>																				
Method of Delivery:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Presentations on key principles</li> <li>• Group &amp; individual task work</li> <li>• Learning activity tasks to complete with pupil</li> <li>• Opportunities to discuss materials and share good practice with fellow students.</li> </ul>
