



- + Remember to submit a complete application:
 - + Certified translated academic transcripts
 - + Personal statement
 - + 1 reference
 - English language qualifications (if applicable)
 - + Passport copy





Postgraduate

- + Apply through Agent Portal
- ♣ Remember to <u>ALWAYS</u> put your agent code on the application in the portal
- Remember to submit a complete application:
 - Certified translated academic transcripts
 - + Personal statement
 - + 2 references
 - ◆ English language qualifications (if applicable)
 - + Passport copy

UG Entry requirements

Common qualifications include:

A Levels - ABB to CCC **IB:** 36 – 26 **USHSD**: 3.0 GPA + 2AP/ 2 SAT subjects

- Interviews & additional criteria for some areas:
 - Art & Design; Medicine; Pharmacy; Physiotherapy; Podiatry; Product Design; Teaching; Humanities
- Arts courses require a portfolio and interview
- Flexible admissions policy

PG Entry Requirements

- Good Bachelors degree typically 2:2 or above
- The Brighton MBA programmes at least 3 years management/ professional experience.
- Health sciences some programmes require professional registration (Post Reg) and additional criteria including DBS check & higher IELTS.
- Arts based programmes require portfolios and interviews.
- International equivalencies on each course page
